The Annual Ski Tiger Membership Meeting is tentatively scheduled for Monday, May 10th. The purpose of this meeting is to look back at the 2020-21 season and forward to the 2021-22 season, as well as elect Ski Tiger board members for the upcoming year.

Ski Tiger Girls 2021 State Champions

The Copper Country girls competition team placed first, and the boys placed second at the 2021 Michigan State High School Cross-Country Ski Championships. The combined Copper Country teams placed a close second (with 586 points) to the Traverse City VASA Ski Club (593 points), which is coached by Ski Tiger alumna Ruth Oppliger, breaking an eight-year winning streak by the Ski Tigers competition team. Seven teams consisting of 61 athletes participated in the event hosted by Copper Country Ski Tigers at our very own Michigan Tech Ski Trails.



The championship included pursuit races: a skate race on Friday, and a classic style race on Saturday. Racers' times for the two races were combined to determine the final pursuit standings.

In addition to the pursuit race, the skiers also competed in a classic style sprint race in the afternoon on Saturday. All races were individual starts to assure safe distance, due to pandemic restrictions.

Ingrid Seagren paced the Copper Country girls team with a third-place individual finish in the pursuit races and second place in the classic sprint race. Kora Johnson placed fourth in the pursuit races and was followed by Autumn Eles, Sage Resh-Chimner, Robin Kisiel and Jaden Sarefin in 5^{th} , 6^{th} , 7^{th} and 8^{th} places, respectively. Aster and Wubbie Anderson were 22^{nd} and 23^{rd} , respectively, in the skate race.

Mike Fraley paced the boys team with a second place finish in the pursuit races. Eric Weiss and Cyrus Hamlin placed 5^{th} and 6^{th} , respectively, in the pursuit races, and Birk Seagren was 10^{th} . Quentin Niemi came in 22^{nd} , followed by Ilya Velat, Augie Hamlin and Grant Fredrickson in 25^{th} , 26^{th} and 27^{th} , respectively. Ben Hiller rounded out the team placing 34^{th} .

Mike Fraley won the sprint race in a blazing time of 3 minutes and 30 sec. Marie Velat won the adaptive sprint race.

Anabel Needham competes in NCAA Championships

Jackson, NH – Ski Tiger alumna Anabel Needham qualified for, and competed in, the 2021 NCAA Championships as a member of the Michigan Tech team this past month. The NCAA Championships is the highest level of competitive events for a collegiate skier. Participants are selected on a regional basis from the Central, Eastern, and Western regions of the U.S. Only the very best skiers from each region qualify to compete in this event.

Anabel placed 19th in the 5 km classic race and 26th place in the 15 km freestyle event. Michigan Tech Nordic ski coach Tom Monahan Smith said, "Anabel had two strong performances and had an incredibly respectable 19th place finish in the classic."



Anabel also won the classic 5 km race on when Michigan Tech hosted the NCAA Central Regional Championships on February 27, 2021.

Fellow Comp Team skier Ingrid Seagren caught up with Kora and Mike and asked them a bit about their experiences in Ski Tigers and their plans for the future.

Q: When did you first start skiing? Kora: When I was four or five, after I got too big for my parents to carry in a backpack.

Mike: Probably when I was four, maybe five, after I moved to Houghton from Minnesota.

Q: How old were you when you joined Ski Tigers and what was your first color group?

Mike: I joined green group when I was four or five.

Q: What are some of the highlights in terms of your performance on the race teams (Devos and Comp Team)?

Kora: I was really proud to qualify and compete at Junior Nationals in Alaska as a U16. It was such a great experience and a great opportunity to meet other skiers.

Mike: Getting fourth at the Hodag Meet and beating Jakob [Craig] by a second! Also qualifying and racing at NENSAs [New England Nordic Ski Association U16 Championships] and Junior Nationals in California [as a U18 skier].

Q: You have been really successful at Nordic skiing. What factors do you think contributed most to your success?

Kora: Having a really supportive team and community around me who are just as excited as I am to ski and race.

Mike: Being dedicated to the sport by making sure I got out for a ski on the off-days.

Q: What post-Ski Tigers plans do you have? Do you plan to continue skiing competitively as a club or team member?

Kora: After graduation I'll be at Michigan Tech for environmental engineering. I plan to continue skiing competitively on the Michigan Tech Ski Club Team.

Mike: I plan to go to Michigan Tech and then into the Army, after that I'd like to start a business. I'm planning on skiing for an Army Ski Team post college.

Q: Classic or skate?

Kora: Skate even though I learned classic

Mike: 100% classic!

Q: The pandemic obviously changed many aspects of Ski Tigers racing, travel, and even practice. What did you miss the most this past year?

Kora: I miss cooking meals and big team meetings and traveling together, fighting over who has to clean the dishes or who gets the bigger bed. We're a really small, close-knit team and we're always so supportive of each other. I also really miss being able to hug my teammates and others racers at the finish line. Cross country skiing is unusual in that even your competition becomes your friends because it's such a niche, grueling sport.

Mike: Definitely our team ski trips.

Q: Do you have any advice for Ski Tigers skiers who are considering joining the Devo or Comp Team next year?

Kora: You'll learn a lot more than just skiing. I had so much fun on both teams, and I have lots of really good memories especially from a time when a group of us (Ski Tigers and alumni) skied on the edge of Lake Superior from McClain State Park all the way up to Eagle River, MI.

Mike: Being on the Ski Team is loads of fun. The trips are amazing and we really bond together as teammates. You will have to work hard, but it pays off in the end.

Q: Favorite Ski Tigers quote?
